

Additionally, the delegation should furnish the differing impacts of the topic in society, if there has been an increase throughout the years, and finally any economic costs that the topic may have an effect on.

**Delegation's history:**

When addressing the delegation's history, the delegate should focus on the topic's impact regarding their designated territory throughout the topic. They may include how the topic affected their alliances since this adds up to the delegation's involvement in the topic. It is recommended to affix historical events that have affected the country's development, always emphasizing on the relation to the subject of matter.

**Delegation's position:**

The delegation clearly states whether the delegation is in favor or against regarding the topic

**Justifying the position:**

The delegation should develop a clear and well substantiated justification of the position the country takes place in.

**Possible solutions:**

The delegate should provide a list of minimum three possible solutions in order to work out on a resolution for the corresponding topic.

**Note:** These solutions are different from the crisis' resolution paper and general voted resolutions. This section only applies to the TOPIC'S POSSIBLE INITIAL RESOLUTION.
